OPEN WOMEN'S K1 ATHLETE

	What Athlete has to do:	Selection Process:	Selection Dates
ICF World Champs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Must be eligible* (see cl 2.1 of Policy) to compete for NZ; and, - Must compete in the 2018 CRNZ National Champs Regatta in a K1 Open Event; and, - Must compete in a selection trial (if eligible) and a trial (Step 2) is required; and, - Must compete in World Cup 1 (if eligible) and if required (Step 3) 	<p>The process for selecting WK1 200 and WK1 500 Athletes for 2018 World Champs is as follows:</p> <p><u>STEP 1: National Championships (23-25 February 2018)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Athletes must compete in the event for which they seek selection ie WK1 200 or 500 Open Event (except Incumbent who does not have to compete but may do so). No claims for Exceptional Circumstances can be made. o If the Incumbent competes and wins by 2% margin in an event, she will be selected for World Championships for that event and the selection process for that event ends there. o If the Incumbent does not compete or does not win by 2% margin in an event, the Incumbent and the next best two placed athletes in that event will progress to a Selection Trial (Step 2). <p><u>STEP 2: Selection Trials (to be held in Europe on 19 May 2018)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o The Athletes eligible for the Selection Trials must travel to and compete in the trial for their event (ie WK1 200 and WK1 500). o If there are Exceptional Circumstances or adverse condition the Selectors can reschedule or repeat the Selection Trials. o The Selection Trial for each of WK1 200 and WK1 500 will be one race for each event. o If the Incumbent wins the Selection Trial for an event (by any margin), she will be selected for World Championships for that event and the selection process for that event ends there. o If the Incumbent does not win the Selection Trial for an event, then the winner of the Selection Trial and the Incumbent in that event will compete in World Cup 1 in their Event (Step 3). <p><u>STEP 3: World Cup 1 (24-27 May 2018 - Szeged)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o The highest place getter, between the Incumbent and the winner of the Selection Trial, at World Cup 1 in their event will be selected for that event for the World Championships. 	<p>The following are the selection dates if all 3 steps are required:</p> <p>Step1: 13 Mar 2018 Step 2: 21 May 2018 Step 3: 27 May 2018</p>
ICF World Cups	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Must be eligible* (see cl 2.1 of Policy) to compete for NZ 	<p>Except for the WK1 Athletes in World Cup 1 if <u>Step 3</u> is required, there is no selection process for WK1 Athletes to compete in WK1 200 and WK1 500 events at World Cups. The CRNZ Coaches will decide which Athletes will compete in WK1 Events, which may only include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - the Incumbent (if she is selected for World Champs prior to the World Cups) - Crew Athletes who have been selected to the New Zealand Team, for competition experience.

ICF World Cups	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Must be eligible* (see cl 2.1 of Policy) to compete for NZ; and, - Must compete in the 2018 CRNZ National Champs Regatta in a K1 Open Event (200 or 1000) for which MK1 Athlete is seeking selection; and - Must compete in a selection trial (if eligible) if a trial is required by CRNZ (Step 2) 	<p>The process for selecting MK1 200 and MK1 1000 Athletes for 2018 World Cups is as follows:</p> <p><u>STEP 1: National Championships (23-25 February 2018)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Athletes must compete in the event for which they seek selection ie MK1 200 or 1000 Open Event. o Selectors then assess the results of the first and second placed athletes in the Open final of each event, and decide if they are satisfied that any of these MK1 Athletes are capable of reaching an A Final at World Cups o If any of those MK1 Athletes satisfy the criteria. the Selectors will invite them to a Selection Trial <p><u>STEP 2: Selection Trials (5 March 2018)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The format of the Selection Trial will be such number of races as are necessary in each event (MK1 200 and MK1 1000) until an MK1 Athlete in each event achieves two wins. The MK1 Athlete in each event who won at National Champs will count as one win for that event. - The MK1 Athlete in each event who is first to achieve two wins will be selected for the World Cups. 	13 Mar 2018
ICF World Champs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Same as above; and, - Must have competed as a member of the NZ Team in the 2018 ICF World Cups in the Event (200 or 1000) for which seeking selection 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The selectors must be satisfied that the MK1 Athlete has the capability of Top 12 placing in MK1 200 or MK1 1000 at the World Champs - In deciding capability, Selectors will <u>only</u> look at results from 2018 World Cups - Selectors may also look at other factors such as assessments, test results, trajectory of results over time; relationships with other athletes etc 	27 May 2018
