



SELECTION POLICY – 2019 ICF JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP – K1 EVENTS

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 **Aims:** CRNZ's aims in selecting Athletes to compete in the 2019 ICF Junior World Championship are as follows:

- (a) to provide development opportunities for Athletes; and
- (b) to achieve outstanding results for New Zealand.

1.2 **CRNZ Selection Regulations:** You should read this Policy in conjunction with the CRNZ Selection Regulations ("**Regulations**"). In particular, you should be aware of:

- (a) the process you need to follow if you feel you have been affected by Exceptional Circumstances (see clause 10 of the Regulations); and
- (b) the process you must follow if you wish to make an Appeal in respect of any aspect of the Selection process (see clause 11 of the Regulations).

1.3 **Definitions:** Where a word is capitalised it will have a definition. Definitions can be found in Appendix 1 of the Regulations.

1.4 **Regatta and Events:** This document sets what you need to do to be selected to compete in the 2019 ICF Junior World Championship in the following Events:

(a) **Specified Events** (see clause 5 of the Regulations)

WK1 200	1
WK1 500	1
MK1 200	1
MK1 1000	1

(b) **Additional Events:** CRNZ may select Athletes or Crews to compete in events other than those listed in the table above – see clause 7 of the Regulations

1.5 Athletes who wish to be considered for Selection must complete an Athlete Application form by the Application Date set out in the table at clause 1.6 below (see clause 4.1 of the Regulations). This form is available on the CRNZ website.

1.6 **Important Dates:** The following are the key dates for this Policy:

Application Date	1 February 2019
NZ National Championship	15-17 February 2019
CRNZ K1 Trials	25-27 February 2019
K1 Selection Date	8 March 2019

1.7 **Funding and Support:** If you are selected, you will be eligible for the following funding and support from CRNZ:

1.8 **Cost:** If you are selected, it will cost you approximately \$7000 to attend the World Championship, including the pre-Worlds training camp.

2. PROCESS

2.1 **Outline:** In order to be selected, you need to:

- (a) meet all of the Eligibility Criteria – see Part 2 of the Regulations; and
- (b) win the Trial – see clause 3 below and Part 3 of the Regulations; and
- (c) meet the Performance Criteria set out at clause 4 below – see Part 4 of the Regulations (subject to any Exceptional Circumstances).

3. NOMINATION

3.1 **Pre-conditions:** You must fulfil the following pre-conditions:

- (a) compete in the 2019 CRNZ Sprint Nationals in a Junior K1 event;
- (b) if invited, compete in the Junior K1 Trial.

3.2 **Invitation to Trial:** The first three placed competitors in each Specified Event at the CRNZ National Sprint Championship will be eligible to compete in the CRNZ Junior K1 Trial.

3.3 **Trial Races:** In each Event, the first Athlete to win two races out of the following will be put forward to Selectors for consideration:

- (i) CRNZ National Sprint Championship, Junior A Final;
- (ii) CRNZ Junior K1 Trial – 25-27 February 2019 (see below).

3.4 **CRNZ Trial:** The format of each Trial for each Event will be the number of races necessary to find the first Athlete in that Event to win two races. The final of the 2019 CRNZ National Championship will count as the first of the races.¹

4. PERFORMANCE CRITERIA AND SELECTION

4.1 **Performance Criteria:** Selectors must be satisfied that an Athlete has the potential to represent New Zealand at the 2024 or 28 Olympic Games, and that attending the 2019 ICF Junior World Championship will be a suitable opportunity to continue his/her development towards that goal.

4.2 **Selection:** If Selected, you must:

- (a) complete a CRNZ Athlete Agreement within 10 working days of the Selection Date; and

¹ For example, if an Athlete in the Trial is first placed at the 2019 CRNZ National Championship, and then placed first in the first trial race, this will count as two wins, and as such he/she would be the first to win two races and no further race in the Trial would be required. If however that same athlete placed second in the first race of the Trial, a second trial race would be required to determine which of the athletes would be the first to win two races. Trial racing will continue until such time as an Athlete is the first to win two races in their Event.

- (b) indicate to CRNZ within 10 working days of the Selection Date that you are willing to pay any cost associated with attending the Regatta(s) for which you have been Selected.
